Academy Improvement Priorities

Following on from the success of the 2015 results, we are determined to ensure our school continues to make progress and improve in the provision we provide.

This academic year, the key priorities for improvement will be:

- consistently challenges all pupils, particularly the most able, so that they engage in their learning;
- provide pupils with more opportunities to use and apply their mathematical skills to problem solving situations;
- to strengthen the strategies we use to improve progress and raise attainment for disadvantaged pupils; and
- to teach a structured progression of spelling skills which children can apply in their writing.

Our Improvement director, Pat Hunt, will work with the school to ensure we have appropriate training and make good progress within these key areas.

We also value your feedback, ideas and suggestions on ways in which we can improve. We will continue to hold parent forums and post surveys on the school app. Most of all we value those face to face conversations that take place with yourselves and encourage you to continue to support and engage with the school.

Holiday requests

IMPORTANT INFORMATION Holidays during term time.

You have to get permission from

the Principal if you want to take your child out of school during term time.

You can only do this if:

- you make an application to the principal in advance (as a parent the child normally lives with)
- there are **EXCEPTIONAL** circumstances

Legislation issued in February 2015 now dictates that you may **be fined** if your child has 10 sessions (five days) of unauthorised absence. The period for calculating the ten sessions will be based on the previous three school terms.

There is no longer a requirement that attendance drops below a certain level – you can be fined irrespective of overall attendance.
