# Sun Academy Bradwell uniform code

We are very proud of our academy and pupils and we want others to see them in the same light.

A smart uniform that is worn properly gives a good impression and shows that the children are part of a proud academic family.

### Pupils should wear:

- Maroon V neck sweatshirt or cardigan – with school logo (The sweatshirt will have a blue stripe in the neck, cuff and welt; burgundy jumpers are not appropriate)
- Blue and maroon stripe tie (Year 1 to 6) these must be worn.
- White shirt (white polo shirt for Nursery & Reception)
- Charcoal grey trousers/skirt
- Black school shoes NO trainers.

Some parents have experienced difficulties finding Charcoal grey. Please ensure trousers/skirts are grey *not* black.

Please make sure all items, including ties are labelled with your child's name.

# Reading homework

All pupils have reading homework each night and we ask you hear your child for a minimum of five minutes and sign their homeacademy diaries.

Pupils who haven't read at night will be supported by undertaking five minutes during morning break. You will receive a text for missing home-academy diaries.

We are still using the accelerated reading bandings for home reading books however pupils no longer take the quiz. We now ask that at the end of the book the children complete a book review.

Following analysis of the AR quizzes we found that they were not having an impact on the progress the pupils made. We have therefore decided to use this money to enhance the reading provision and buying more engaging books for the pupils to read.

## **Parking**
