## Thursday, 07<sup>th</sup> March is World Book Day!

"World Book Day is on a mission to give every child a book of their own. It's a celebration of authors, illustrators, books and (most importantly) it's a celebration of reading." WBD website.

To celebrate this, and to raise the profile of reading in school, reading based activities will be taking place to teach the importance of enjoying a good book.

## Firstly, children may come to school on this day dressed as a character linked to their year group's chosen theme. (see below)

- **Early Years (nursery and reception):** <u>Fairy Tale characters</u> any character from traditional tales such as The Gingerbread Man, Cinderella, Three Little Pigs, Rapunzel, Jack, Puss in Boots, etc.
- Years 1 & 2: <u>Charles Dickens' characters</u> e.g. Oliver Twist urchins, Ebeneezer Scrooge, the 3 ghosts, Miss Havisham, the Artful Dodger, Nancy.
- Years 3 & 4: <u>David Walliams' characters</u> e.g. Gangsta Granny, Mr Stink, Billionaire Boy, The Queen or her Orang-Utan
- Years 5 & 6: <u>Witches and Wizards</u> any characters from books such as The Harry Potter series, The White Witch, Gandalf, Wizard of Oz,

Children should also bring in **their favourite book** as they will be able to read and share this with other children as the theme this year is '**Share a Story**'. Throughout school, themed activities will be planned based around reading and having book-based fun.

Finally, all children will receive a book token that they can take to a local bookseller and can use it to pick one of TEN (exclusive, new and completely free) books. Or, if they'd rather, they can use it to get  $\pounds 1$  off any book or audio book costing over  $\pounds 2.99$  at a participating bookshop or book club.
