We have had an excellent start to this academic year and the first half term has seen some amazing learning happen.

As always, we begin each year by reviewing the successes of the previous year and creating an action plan for the areas we want to work on to make our school an even more successful place to learn. The academies academic results at the end of last year were amongst some of the best we have ever had. Our Early years children finished the year performing in line with pupils nationally. Our key stage 1 and 2 pupils saw results that were above national percentages. In fact, in reading we are within the top 10% of school in the country. In the coming year, we want to further develop our Early Years provision, challenging opportunities in mathematics and assessments in the foundation subjects. We have already begun to work on this and are seeing the huge benefits from making this our focus in 2017-2018.

KINGSWOOD TRIP YEAR 6


Please ensure all deposits (£20) for the Kingswood residential visit are paid by Monday 30th October. This will ensure that we secure all the places we need for this exciting adventure.
