The moon is a natural satellite of the earth and is a place with no air, no water and no life. It has lots of craters, many of which can be seen with the naked eye, from where it has been hit by meteors. It is brightly lit in the night sky not because it emits its own light but because it reflects the light of the sun. It orbits the earth once every 28 days and as it does so it appears to change shape because of the direction of the sun.

Crescent and Gibbous


A crescent moon is when we can only see a crescent-shaped area of the Moon.




waxing crescent moon

Waxing means that we can see more of the Moon.










