Wednesday 3rd March 2021 English - SPAG - Learning Objective - Can I find and use conjunctions in longer sentences? In this part of the text "Making slabs", model finding the conjunction and writing out the two sentences that were joined together to make a compound sentence.

Flat slabs of clay can be used for tiles or for building boxes and containers. You will need a piece of cotton cloth (old cotton sheeting is ideal), a rolling pin and two lengths of wood. Place a ball of clay between the wooden lengths and flatten it with the rolling pin. The thickness of the wood controls the thickness of the slab.

Wednesday 3rd March 2021 English - SPAG - Learning Objective - Can I find and use conjunctions in longer sentences? Now in this next part, find the conjunction and write the two sentences that have been joined together to make compound sentence.

When joining coils or attaching small pieces of clay to larger pieces, the clay surfaces should be scored then moistened with water before being pressed and smoothed together. Allow all slab pieces to harden slightly first, so that they can be handled without losing their shape.

find and use conjunctions in longer sentences? Main - Find the conjunctions in these sentences I have chosen from the part of the book "techniques"

- 1) Press the two edges together and use your fingers or a modelling tool to smooth the joins.
- 2) This will harden the clay completely but only do it when the instructions say so.
- 3) Poster paints can also be used but you will need to seal them with varnish.
- 4) The colours can be sponged on or you can use a brush to paint patterns.
- 5) Paintbrushes must be cleaned after so then they don't get ruined by dry paint.

Extend - Here are some compound sentences in the "Swinging Tiger" and "Flower Pot" sections. Find the conjunction, then write what the two sentences were that are joined together.

- 1) Model the bottom of the body and pull the legs out towards you. Add the eyes and ears.
- Poll out a piece of clay and use the technique shown on page 14 to make small flower heads. Squeeze pieces of clay between your fingers and model them to form longer flower heads.

Air-drying clay is not waterproof, but you could build up the coils around a small glass jar, so you can then fill it with water and real flowers.
