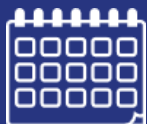

Thank you and welcome!

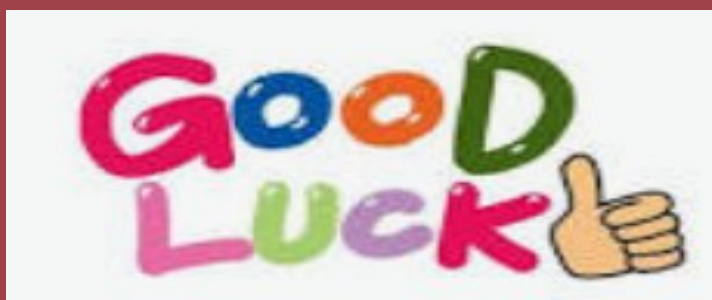

School Day

The Department for Education have stipulated that the school day must be extended for 32.5 hours for all children. This means that we need to increase our academy day by 10 minutes per day. Our school day will now run from 8:50am—3:15 (EYFS/KS1) or 3:20pm (KS2). The doors will open at 8:40 and close at 8:50. Any pupil arriving after this time will be marked as late.

The academy day starts with a morning meeting and early morning work at 8:50am which sets the children up for a positive start to the day and outlines the daily activities. Please support us in making the day as positive as possible.
